The Polish-Romanian scientific relations 1918-1939

SUMMARY

After 1918 the Polish-Romanian scientific relations were developed under influence of political alliance between Poland and Romania.

The most important contribution to development of these relations was made by some known scientists, who took part also in political life of theirs countries (for example: Nicolae Iorga, Petre Panaitescu, Stanisław Wędkiewicz, Oskar Halecki). These scientific-political relations were established first of all in philology (Polish and Romanian) and in historian sciences. They were consolidated by Polish-Romanian cultural agreement in 1936.

The article discusses the development of the Polish-Romanian scientific relations between 1918-1939 and their importance for both countries – Poland and Romania.
