**The legacy of the Rev. Krzysztof Kluk as presented in the Museum
of Agriculture at Ciechanowiec**

SUMMARY

The Rev. Krzysztof Kluk Agricultural Museum was founded in 1963. One of the fundamental tasks of this institution is to collect all the available documents, memorabilia, and papers of our patron. Moreover, it is important that the person of Rev. Krzysztof Kluk be present thematically in each of the sections of the Museum. The current paper presents the preliminary results of an analysis of this aspect. No effort was made on my part to assess the material submitted by the Museum's employees, instead it is presented as it was received, and thus the interpretation left to the reader's discretion. In the short introduction with which I preface this collected material I take my own turn to search for our patron K. Kluk in the Museum of Agriculture in Ciechanowiec, with a short description of how such a unique museum, of which I am a co-founder and long-serving head, was created. Our most timely and important duty is to present the scientific output of Rev. K. Kluk, little of which, despite the passage of two centuries, has become obsolete. In our search for environmental solutions that would be in line with Nature's laws, we will sooner or later have to turn to the books of the naturalist from Ciechanowiec, who, many years ago, established what is good and friendly, and what is not, both for humanity and for what is widely understood to be the natural environment. The thoughts and scientific achievements of our patron reside in each of the permanent and temporary exhibitions of the Museum of Agriculture. A visit of only a few hours permits our guests to become intimately acquainted with the Museum's patron and his still ever-valid thoughts, which he left to us for practical application throughout our lives.
